Autumn Leaves Cycling Map

Curated by our Concierge, this 9-kilometre cycling route takes approximately 50 minutes to complete.



Ueno Park

1 Gyoko-dori

A tree-lined avenue connecting the outer garden of the Imperial Palace and Tokyo Station. In autumn, the stately street lights up as the gingko trees turn golden-yellow, while in summer fresh green leaves dazzle the eye.

2 Imperial Palace East Garden

A sprawling garden in the centre of Tokyo. The East Garden is the only part of the inner palace area that is open to the public on regular days. Stroll through the landscaped grounds for a pleasant escape into nature.

3 Yasukuni Shrine

A Shinto shrine founded by Emperor Meiji in 1869. The shrine commemorates those who died in service of Japan, from the Boshin War (1868-69) to the First Indochina War (1946-54). The Yushukan War Memorial Museum is also located within the grounds.

MOMAT

The foremost museum exhibiting modern Japanese art. The collection features several notable Japanese artists since the Meiji period as well as a selection of contemporary Western prints.

6 Hibiya Park

Japan's first Western-style public park. Home to thousands of trees and seasonal flower gardens, the 16-hectare park has a storied past. It was used as a ground for feudal lords during the Edo era, then as a military parade square for much of the Meiji period.

6 Chidorigafuchi Moat

A moat around the Imperial Palace, famed for its sakura splendour. Cherry blossom season or not, consider renting a rowboat to glide down the calm waters. The surrounding walkways are tailormade for relaxing strolls.

Chidorigafuchi

A historical park overlooking the Imperial Palace moat. It features a five-kilometre circular walking course, with one entrance located very close to Kudanshita Station. While the park is best known for its cherry blossom views, it is worth a visit at any time of year.

3 Science Museum

A museum designed mainly for children accompanied by parents. Located in Kitanomarukoen, the venue offers an enjoyable and educational outing for the entire family. The striking building features a white concrete exterior with lattice-work.

Nippon Budokan

An indoor arena, originally built as the official competition venue for judo in the 1964 Tokyo Summer Olympics. The word "budokan" means "martial arts hall". Today, the Nippon Budokan hosts the National Championships for judo, kendo, aikido, karate and naginata.

Olchigokan Museum

A museum dedicated to late 19th century Western art. The red brick and concrete structure is a recreation of the original Mitsubishi Ichigokan structure that stood on the same spot. It is surrounded by several high-rise buildings of the Mitsubishi conglomerate.

Brick Square

Akasaka Imperial Palace

A charming square courtyard with art and greenery, situated amid European-style buildings. With a collection of cafes, alfresco restaurants and boutiques, this hidden gem invites visitors to enjoy a few leisurely hours.
